St. Catherine of Siena— April 29

“The youngest of many children, St. Catherine of Siena began to experience God mystically before she turned seven. Frequent visions of Christ, angels and saints inspired her holy, austere life and she took the habit of the Dominican Tertiaries at age 16. She then learned to read and write (perhaps miraculously) and went on to craft many letters to religious and political leaders and eventually persuaded the Pope to return to Rome, where she died at age 33.”* (*Tan Classics book cover)

One of the most famous works is the transcription of her conversation with God called: **“The Dialogue of St. Catherine of Siena”**- the book (Tan Classics translation) is available for purchase in our Holy Cross Chapel bookstore (on the second floor).
